

VACANCIES FOR LIVERY CHARITY TRUSTEES

The charitable arm of the Worshipful Livery Company of Wales is seeking to appoint two new Trustees to fill future vacancies in the spring of 2024.

The new Trustees would be joining a team of seven existing Trustees. A Trustee normally serves a term of 5 years and can be reappointed for a second 5-year term.

The role does not require any specific legal or other professional background. However, knowledge or experience generally in charity or other governance, investments and legal matters are all part of the new Trustee's brief (experience as a school governor, for example, or similar would help). The Trust meets in Cardiff three times a year and the role is unpaid.

Any Liveryman who would like to be considered for the role is encouraged to have an informal conversation in the first instance with either the Chair or the Secretary.
