NORTH WALES COMMITTEE REPORT

The work of the NWC is focused on events in the northern counties of Wales, namely Anglesey, Conwy, Denbigh, Fflint, Gwynedd, Wrexham and northern Powys and on awards relevant to these areas. Members of the NWC may also assist in the awards process for other recipients in the area, covered by the central WLCoW budget such as RAF Valley and NPTC, Newtown.

The committee is a small one but we are pleased to announce two new members: Brenda and Peter Bignold from Conwy. We were also delighted to welcome back Rhiannon Humphreys-Jones after her enforced absence on health grounds. We also recognise the support of Edwina Morris Jones and Eurwen Hulmston who assist with the schools awards.

We can look back with pleasure at the Advent Carol Service in St Asaph Cathedral, preceded by lunch and are beginning to think about Advent 2024 when the format will have changed somewhat. The Master read a lesson at the service. Meanwhile we have planned the N Wales week-end (22-24 March 2024) based on the southern half of Anglesey and taking in the salt works (Halen Môn) with its attendant gin production, the Sea Zoo and the stately home and grounds of Plas Newydd. A number of options are also available for participants on the Sunday, particularly based in the area of Beaumaris.

The Awards programme includes recognition of young musicians, school pupils, veterinary and agricultural students and motor engineering apprentices. These are mostly on track but some may be delayed until the 24/25 budget year. Nevertheless, it is anticipated that most, if not all, of the £5000 NWC awards budget will be spent.

NORTH WALES WEEKEND AT YNYS MÔN. 22nd. TO 24th .MARCH 2024

On a chilly Saturday (23rd March) a good number of Liverymen from North Wales, the South and London had a fascinating tour of one of Anglesey's great success stories: Halen Môn. We were introduced to a variety of salts, including some of the excellent local products, and the differences between them were demonstrated by the tips of our tongues. We were shown the process (at a safe and sanitary distance) by which 25,000 litres of very good quality sea water taken every day from the Menai Straits is filtered again and again down to 1 micron before being evaporated in 24 hours to a crop of beautiful crystals. These are washed, which gave us pause for thought. How do you wash salt? The answer was to use super concentrated brine. Why wash it? Because it's not just salt crystals that are formed: there are tiny particles of things like chalk which would impart an off-flavour.



A bonus to this first part of the North Wales week-end was the careful checking of another product of the Halen Môn company: salted gin! Thus fortified, we hit the retail outlet to good effect. The instruction then was "The rest of afternoon is your own. Just be at the ballroom at the Bulkeley Hotel for the reception at 19:00hrs before dinner at 20:00hrs." The choices open to us were the adjacent Sea Zoo. Plas Newydd

history and militaria (plus the Rex Whistler mural), Oriel Ynys Môn with its exhibition of Tunnicliffes, Kyffin Williams and modern photographic art works and anything else that took our fancy.



Dinner in the hotel was just right. Our company changed however: we lost three and gained three: which spread the joy. We just about managed to get to bed before the witching hour and woke to a sunny morning.

Nine of us decided to visit Penmon, the 10th Century stone carvings in its ancient church, the abbey ruins, 16th century dovecote (for 950 birds) and Saint Seiriol's Well. We then drove on to the Point where you look across to Puffin Island (Ynys Seriol). There aren't many puffins there nowadays but there were tens of seals hauled up on the beach and a wild sea passing the lighthouse. A nice breath of fresh air to end our week-end
